Commonly confused homophones.

They're tricky to get right, but it's easy when your teacher explains it like this!

to / too / two

to - a direction or preposition

e.g. I'm going to school.
e.g. We need to go now.

too - as well/also, too much

e.g. I'm going to school, too.
e.g. We have too much homework.

two - the number 2

e.g. I have two literacy classes today.
e.g. Our last class starts at two o'clock.

your / you're

your - shows possession/ownership
(possessive pronoun)

e.g. Your story was really interesting!
e.g. Did you do your homework?

you're - a contraction of 'you are'.

e.g. You're so funny!
e.g. You're in year 7.

their / they're / there

their - shows possession/ownership
(possessive pronoun)

e.g. Their names are Jack and Jill.
e.g. I'm going to their new house.

they're - a contraction for 'they are'

e.g. They're at the market.
e.g. They're not very nice apples.

there - a place
- with the verb 'to be'
(e.g. am, are, is, was, were)

e.g. The market is just over there.
e.g. There are a lot of homophones
in the English language!

its / it's

its - shows possession / ownership
(possessive pronoun)

e.g. That dog is chasing its tail!
e.g. What is its name?

it's - a contraction for 'it is'
or 'it has'

e.g. It's time to go.
e.g. It's been a long time since St. Kilda
won the Grand Final.
