Has someone touched you on a part of your body like your bottom or chest or anywhere else you do not like?

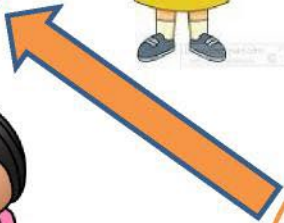
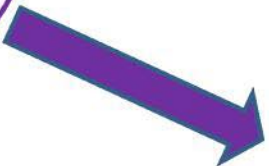
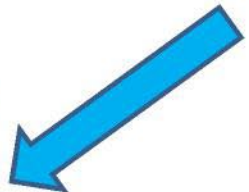
Has someone hit, punched or smacked you or hurt you in anyway?
